**CAMELBACK INN, A JW MARRIOTT RESORT & SPA

LOCATION: This landmark resort, set on 125 acres of lush desert landscape, gives guests an authentic Southwestern experience. Nestled at the base of Mummy Mountain and overlooking the famous Camelback Mountain, this is a place where luxury comes naturally.

ESTABLISHED: Camelback Inn was opened in 1936 by entrepreneur Jack Stewart. Marriott Hotel Corporation acquired the property in 1967 and expanded the resort from 118 to 453 guest rooms. Many other amenities were added throughout the years, as well as extensive meeting and convention facilities.

ACCOMMODATIONS: Camelback Inn has 453 richly appointed guest casitas, each with a private patio or balcony. Included are 27 suites, some with private swimming pools.

Rita's – Traditional Mexican cuisine; Open for lunch, dinner and happy hour

Hoppin' Jacks – Poolside burgers and sandwiches; Open seasonally for lunch

OTHER FACTS ABOUT CAMELBACK INN:

- J. Willard Marriott Sr. and his wife vacationed at Camelback Inn for many years and became so enchanted with the resort that they bought the property in 1967. Bill Marriott Jr., chairman of the board and president of Marriott Corporation, and his family still vacation here each year. Camelback Inn is his favorite Marriott property.
- Camelback Inn was Marriott's first resort and launched the corporation's resort network, which now includes more than 20 resorts.
- Camelback Inn is the only authentic Southwestern resort in Scottsdale.
- Ford Motor Company held the first convention at Camelback Inn in 1950. The convention was held in the only meeting space available – an employee recreation room.
- Camelback Inn's rates on opening day in 1936 were \$10-\$16 per night for a single and \$18-\$25 per night for a double deluxe.
- Dwight D. Eisenhower frequently visited Camelback Inn. Other legendary celebrities who have visited include Robert Young, Clark Gable, Bette Davis, Cary Grant, J.C. Penney and Jimmy Stewart, among others.
- Camelback Inn is the only resort in Arizona to have its own chapel. This small adobe chapel was built in 1959 as a memorial to John C. Lincoln, who financed the Inn.
